

Lactation Training Options for Medical Offices

To improve continuity of care and breastfeeding outcomes for patients, Advancing Breastfeeding in Colorado (ABC) compiled this list of recommended lactation training for various staff within your organization.

1. Introductory Lactation Trainings

As part of the Breastfeeding Friendly Medical Office certification process, all staff should complete BF 101. Providers and staff that have patient contact should complete an additional 1 hour of training annually:

BF 101: Breastfeeding Friendly Medical Office Lunch & Learn - YouTube A free 31-minute video covering basic information about breastfeeding and lactation management. The video can be watched as a group (over a staff lunch or meeting) or individually

- At the end of this video there are two links that detail latch and milk supply

2. Specialty Topics in Lactation and Feeding (Commonly requested by providers and clinical staff)

- ▶ <u>NACCHO Breastfeeding Webinars</u> Free. Length: 1 hour
- ▶ <u>The B.L.A.C.K. Course</u> Cost: \$750. Virtual 5-day, 45-hour course for aspiring IBCLCs and breastfeeding counselors supporting Black communities

3. Lactation Training Certification Options

The following comprehensive courses could prepare staff for IBCLC certification or can be taken independently:

<u>Certified Lactation Counselor (CLC)</u> Includes certifying exam. Ideal for PAs, NPs, RNs, and RDs.

- ▶ In person or online 40 hours
- ▶ For online option, must complete modules, phone observations, and online exam within 6 months from start of course

<u>Certified Lactation Educator (CLE)</u> Ideal for MAs, Patient Navigators, Referral Coordinators, and those providing education and support but without the scope to diagnose.

- ▶ Requirements to obtain the credential include but are not limited to:
 - Attendance in person or online for the 3-day, 21.5-hour course
 - Documented observation/attendance at 2 breastfeeding support groups
 - 4 hours of clinical IBCLC observation
 - 2 letters of recommendation

<u>Community Lactation Access Project (CLAP)</u> Ideal for all levels of staff. Classes are tailored to participants and offer readiness to sit for CLC exam or IBCLC exam (if meeting all other criteria for those courses).

- ▶ Will soon be available in Spanish, and scholarships are available for people who self-identify as Black, Indigenous, Latinx, LGBTQ+, and others
- ▶ In-person and online 45 hours

<u>Institute for the Advancement of Breastfeeding & Lactation Education (IABLE)</u> Training options and courses for all levels of staff with an emphasis on up-to-date information for providers. Offerings include:

- ▶ 5-day clinical "Breastfeeding Medicine Course for Physicians and Other Providers"
- ▶ 16-hour "Outpatient Breastfeeding Champion Course" for medical offices applicable for any staff member who is a breastfeeding supporter
